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

16/09/24	Civil service STEM Challenge 2024 	<u>Who are we?</u> I'm getting in touch as Schools Outreach Lead for the Civil Service STEM Challenge Committee. The STEM Challenge is an initiative designed to promote an understanding of how STEM is used in a governmental context to pupils from underrepresented backgrounds. Teams of 4-6 students in years 9-10 (S2-S3) are asked to prepare a poster or report outlining how STEM-based decisions in government can	<u>What is our plan?</u> The Challenge is now entering its 4th year of operation, and so far has taken place only within England. We are now ready to roll out to the devolved nations, including Scotland, following on from our engagement with DYW back in the Spring (thanks again to those of you who were part of this - we have taken your feedback on board!). The Challenge will start advertising to	<u>What is our ask?</u> Being a part of the Civil Service, we work closely with NISSON (the Northern Ireland and Scotland Schools Outreach Network). Following their advice, and from conversations with yourselves back in May, we have identified our best route in to schools in Scotland is through DYW regional contacts. Our Committee will be looking to contact DYW regional offices again around mid-November with more specific information about the 2025 STEM Challenge. We will be looking for DYW to pass this information on to local schools identified as containing a higher proportion of

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		<p>contribute towards realising the first carbon neutral day in 2050, choosing from four policy themes. For 2024 these themes included humans in space, sustainable agriculture, homes of the future and innovative transport. This year saw the Challenge receive over 100 entries. Entries are marked by a panel of judges from across the Civil Service, and prizes awarded to higher-scoring teams. Prizes this year included: engaging science books, engineering kits, vouchers, and tickets to local science museums.</p>	<p>schools from mid-November, asking for expressions of interest in signing up. The Challenge will then officially launch at the start of the Spring Term, at which point a Challenge briefing pack will be circulated to all interested schools, alongside information packs for teachers and pupils walking them through how to complete the Challenge. These packs have been designed to minimise any additional work for teachers and have received strong positive feedback this year.</p> <p>The Challenge completion deadline will be around the end of the Spring Term. at which point we judge all entries and aim to distribute certificates to all teams and prizes to a selection of winning teams before the end of the school year. We have carefully considered this timeline and put it together based on feedback from teachers, as well as ensuring it aligns with the Scottish school calendar.</p> <p>In addition to the core Challenge, we are also working to be able to offer in-</p>	<p>pupils from underrepresented backgrounds and encourage participation. In England, we currently select schools where 15% or more pupils are on free school meals, but we recognise DYW local offices are best placed to identify the schools in their regions that would most benefit from this opportunity.</p> <p>We are hoping DYW can support with advertising and promoting the Challenge to local schools, while the STEM Challenge Committee will take on the role of distributing launch materials and directly handling queries from schools who sign up. This should reduce any additional workload being placed upon DYW.</p> <p>Next steps</p> <p>Hopefully the above all makes sense and you agree that this initiative will benefit schools across Scotland. 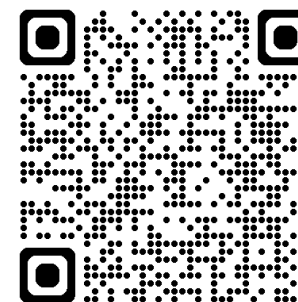


