SSERC have received funding from CITB (Construction Industry Training Board) to run an SSPP opportunity for secondary teachers with their Go Construct STEM Ambassadors.

We have confirmed 2 placements – one of these is with Wills Bros Engineering in Motherwell/Glasgow and this is where I am hoping you can help fill the spots.

Opportunity for teachers with Go Construct STEM Ambassadors

SSERC are bringing secondary teachers in Scotland an immersive and handson experience in industry, which aims to increase knowledge of STEM career pathways and highlight the practical applications of the curriculum. Funded by CITB (Construction Industry Training Board), this is part of the SSERC product Scottish STEM Placement Programme (SSPP): Teacher Education.

The programme involves a 2-day placement in industry in June with a follow up activity for students later in the year. This opportunity will be particularly relevant for technology and physics teachers, but I think there is opportunity for all to learn about careers and the varied opportunities available in construction.
