I'm pleased to say that the third round of the Youth Arts Open Fund opened at 11am today and will close at 5pm on 25 August 2025. You can find the application form and full fund guidance here: Youth Arts Open Fund YouthLink Scotland

The fund is administered by YouthLink Scotland, funded by the Scottish Government through Creative Scotland, and provides grants to support freelance artists (up to £8k) and organisations (up to £15k) in delivering free community-based arts activity for children and young people across Scotland especially those who face access barriers.

Key Details:

- Total funding available: £740,000 (Grant In Aid funding from Scottish Government)
- Project duration: Up to 12 months between November 2025- November 2026.
- Who can apply: Freelance artists or youth/third-sector organisations based in Scotland, with experience working with children and young people.
- Multi-Year Funded Orgs: Eligible to apply, but proposals must be clearly separate from existing Creative Scotland-funded activity.
- Priority: Given to smaller organisations.
- Music: Projects focused solely on music are not eligible.
 Music can be included as part of a wider multi-artform approach. Applicants proposing music-led projects will be signposted to the

Assessment Process:

- Applications will first be checked for eligibility by YouthLink Scotland staff.
- Eligible applications will then be scored by Creative Scotland assessors in September.
- Final decisions will be made in November by a panel of young people, who will prioritise proposals that clearly demonstrate youth voice and leadership.


