




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

Vets told them they couldn't get reliable data from inside calf pens, and research from SRUC confirmed that without measuring the actual conditions inside the pen that calves are living in, the data isn't useful.</p> <p>The team decided to build something that worked properly on farms. That meant a battery-powered sensor that could sit inside the pen, survive the dirt and impact, and send live data using mobile networks without needing any extra equipment or setup. 
