Hear from the team behind Pneumonitor about how damaging invisible disease is and how their new rugged, in-pen calf microclimate monitor is making strides towards preventing calf pneumonia.

This device and platform was created to solve a real and specific problem. Vets told them they couldn't get reliable data from inside calf pens, and research from SRUC confirmed that without measuring the actual conditions inside the pen that calves are living in, the data isn't useful.

The team decided to build something that worked properly on farms. That meant a battery-powered sensor that could sit inside the pen, survive the dirt and impact, and send live data using mobile networks without needing any extra equipment or setup. It had to be simple, accurate and tough enough to do the job.
