

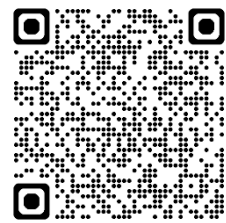

These visits aim to engage pupils in hands-on learning experiences that encourage environmental stewardship and scientific skills. Some of the activities this year will be surveying invertebrates, air quality, birds and wildflowers. During these sessions, students will take part in Citizen Science activities, where they will develop invertebrate identification and surveying skills. They will learn about the critical importance of biodiversity enhancement and the role of recording in conservation efforts. The program includes a fusion of classroom instruction and outdoor, practical learning opportunities, ensuring a comprehensive educational experience. This year is slightly different as we will be offering two sessions (1 school visit from

These skills can then be put into practice during the second session at the depot. Ideally this would be within a couple of weeks of the initial session. The data collected will help us to monitor changes over time at the depot.

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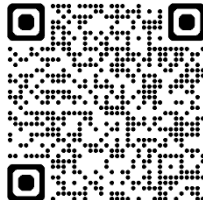

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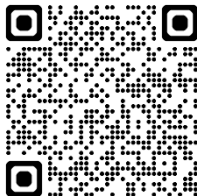
